

1. On June 23, 2008 (the "Petition Date"), the Debtor filed a voluntary petition for relief under Chapter 11 of the Bankruptcy Code (the "Bankruptcy Code") in this Court.

2. The Debtor continues to operate as a debtor-in-possession pursuant to Sections 1107 and 1108 of the Code.

3. No trustee or examiner has been appointed, and no official committee of unsecured creditors has yet been appointed in this case.

4. Contemporaneously with the filing of this Motion, the Debtor has filed the Wage Motion. Although reference is made to Exhibit A in the Wage Motion, it was not attached. The Debtor indicated that the instant Motion would be filed pursuant to MLBR 9018-1.

5. Exhibit A identifies the employees, by name and department, who are to be paid if the Wage Motion is approved by the Court, and sets forth the amounts each such employee will be paid pursuant to any such order and the deductions relating to each such employee's gross pay.

6. Pursuant to MLBR 9018-1, effective May 1, 2008, "for good and sufficient cause the court may order that some or all of the papers in the case be impounded by the Clerk. Such impounded papers shall be maintained under Clerk custody separate and apart from files to which the public has access; no computer or other images thereof shall be made for public viewing." MLBR 9018-1(a).

7. The Debtor seeks impoundment of Exhibit A to the Wage Motion because it contains personal information regarding the hours, rates, weekly per diem, gross pay, monthly insurance benefit amounts, payments due to the Debtor's employees under the Retention Plan and prorated insurance benefit amounts of the salaried management and administrative employees, as well as the regular and overtime hours, gross pay, and union information of the

Debtor's union employees. The Debtor has historically kept this information confidential and protected in order to avoid irreparably harming the Debtor and adversely affecting employee morale. The wage information contained in Exhibit A to the Wage Motion is a matter of privacy to each of the Debtor's employees. Moreover, there exists no legitimate purpose for creditors of the Debtor to receive the additional, personal details of each employee set forth in Exhibit A when the Wage Motion itself sets forth the aggregate amount of Prepetition Wage Obligations and other benefit information sought to be paid pursuant to the relief requested in the Wage Motion. Based upon the foregoing, good and sufficient cause exists to impound Exhibit A under MLBR 9018-1(a).

8. The Debtor intends to continue its privacy policy and therefore requests that the Exhibit A to the Wage Motion be kept under seal by the Court so that the wage information of the employees will not become part of a public record accessible to other employees of the Debtor, the Debtor's creditors, and the public in general.

9. The Debtor requests that any impoundment order remain in effect until further order of the Court. Until the wind down of the Debtor's business affairs has been fully effectuated, the retention and morale of all employees remains a critical concern. The Debtor is unable to predict at this time when continued impoundment shall no longer be required. The Debtor has no suggested custody arrangements for the post-impoundment period outside those set forth in MLBR 9018-1(c).

Emergency Hearing Requested

10. Pursuant to MLBR 9013-1(h), the Debtor has filed an motion for emergency hearing contemporaneously with this Motion.

Notice

11. The Debtor has or will serve this Motion by overnight mail, facsimile, by this Court's ECF System, and/or by e-mail, and will serve the notice of the hearing on this Motion in the same manner, on the Office of the United States Trustee, each taxing authority that has a claim in this case, the Debtor's 20 largest unsecured creditors, all parties known by the Debtor claiming to have liens on or security interests in any of the Debtor's assets, and all parties who have filed a notice of appearance in this case. The Debtor submits that such service provides sufficient notice in light of the nature of the relief requested and request that the Court approve such notice.

WHEREFORE, Modern Continental Construction Co., Inc. respectfully requests that the Court enter an Order: (a) authorizing the impoundment of Exhibit A to the Wage Motion, which, pursuant to MLBR 9018-1(b) has been placed in a separate envelope and conspicuously marked "**FILED SUBJECT TO PENDING IMPOUNDMENT MOTION,**" until further order of Court; and (b) granting to the Debtor such other and further relief as the Court deems just and proper in the circumstances.


