**ORDER APPROVING MOTION BY DEBTORS AND DEBTORS-IN-POSSESSION TO
(A) PAY PREPETITION WAGES, SALARIES, COMMISSIONS, EXPENSES, AND
BENEFITS; AND (B) USE EXISTING PAYROLL ACCOUNTS AND BUSINESS FORMS**


*Upon the Motion by Debtors and Debtors-in-Possession to (A) Pay Prepetition Wages,
Salaries, and Benefits; and (B) Use Existing Payroll Accounts and Business Forms (the "Wage*

Motion”)¹ of the above-captioned debtors and debtors-in-possession (the “Debtors”) for entry of an order pursuant to sections 507(a)(4), 507(a)(5), 363(b) and 105(a) of the Bankruptcy Code authorizing the Debtors to pay prepetition wages, salaries, expenses, and benefits, and to use existing payroll accounts and business forms; and due and proper notice of the Wage Motion having been given; and after due deliberation and sufficient cause appearing; therefore; and no party in interest being unduly prejudiced thereby; it is hereby **ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED** that:

1. The Wage Motion is granted; and it is further
2. General Trading is authorized, ~~but not directed~~, to pay the Prepetition Wage Obligations, including all outstanding wages and vacation pay accrued by their employees prior to the Petition Date including the full amount of unpaid reimbursable expenses and benefits as they may come due on or after the Petition Date;
3. General Trading is authorized to permit the employees to use prepetition accrued and unpaid vacation time and sick leave;
4. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to be an assumption or adoption of any agreement or policy;
5. Notwithstanding Rules 4001 and 6004(g) of the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure, this Order shall become effective upon its entry;
6. This Court shall retain jurisdiction to construe and enforce the terms of this Order.
